## What will you and your organization do to have an impact?

**It began with a hypothesis:** that the life science industry's commitment to tackling the most complex medical challenges could be replicated to help solve a vexing social issue—poverty in Greater Boston and beyond. We believe that the industry's culture of innovation, collaboration, and risk taking in search of breakthroughs could be brought to bear on food insecurity, homelessness, and unequal access to education and opportunity.

In this last year, we reached proof of concept and brought those aspirations to life. When the pandemic pushed more of our neighbors to the brink, we were ready to respond. Having built strong community partnerships and a network of committed corporate partners, advisors, and volunteers, Life Science Cares was able to speed resources—critical funding, volunteer hours, donations of goods, and strategic support—into communities that were most impacted by this crisis.

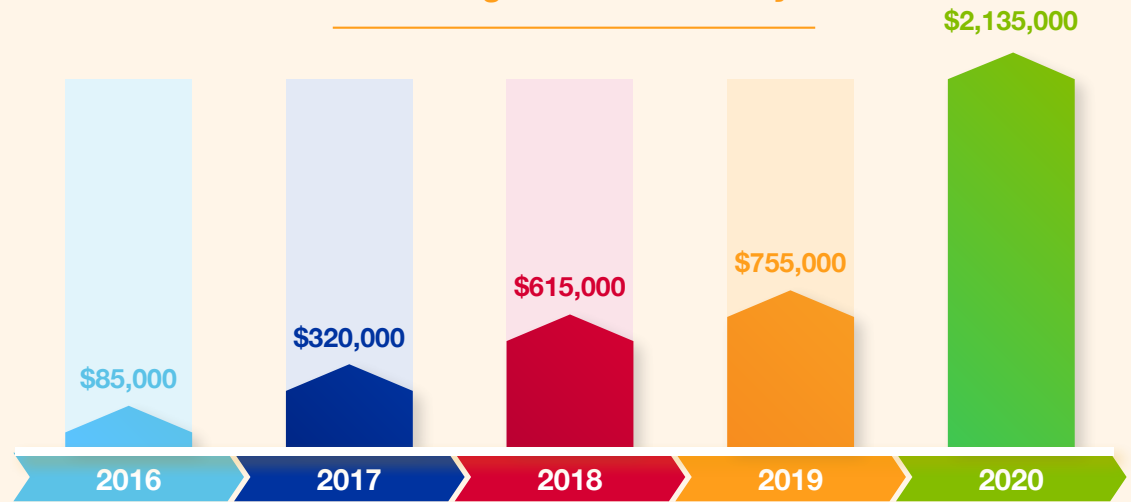


## Power of Partnership

The nonprofits we work with are more than just affiliated organizations or channels for funding: we think of them as our partners and **we stand by them every way that we can**. We listen closely to find out what they really need to do the work that they are passionate about and tailor our efforts to address their concerns. We are committed to providing flexible, evolving, collaborative support to our partner nonprofits that responds efficiently to their changing needs and circumstances.

Life Science Cares partners with nonprofit organizations in the Greater Boston area that are working to help our neighbors access basic needs, educational opportunities, and sustainable careers. In addition to significant, multi-year funding, we provide access to a network of thousands of volunteers, hundreds of thousands of dollars of donated goods, and connections to the brightest problem solvers in our industry. The result: cash investments into partner organizations are supercharged with the time and talent of the life science community.

## Growing Together: Life Science Cares & Food for Free

Our partnership with [Food For Free](#) is a perfect example of how Life Science Cares has supported an organization's growth with **creative solutions to challenging problems**. One of our first grantees, Food For Free improves access to healthy food within our community by rescuing food that would otherwise go to waste and creating new distribution channels to reach under-served populations. Food For Free places an emphasis on utilizing community partnerships and school systems to reach those in need.

Food For Free is chosen as one of Life Science Cares' inaugural partners.

LSC funds work to scale and formalize the Family Meals program, which transforms surplus food from institutional cafeterias into pre-packed meals for our neighbors facing food insecurity. The goal was to deliver 21,000 meals in 2017. As the program grows, LSC convenes corporate cafeteria managers to coordinate food donations to Food For Free, growing the program. LSC recruits volunteer teams to help package rescued food.

Food For Free completes a strategic plan, which recommends growing Family Meals, bringing on new distribution partners, and more effectively targeting college students. LSC funds another year of growth, with a new goal of 30,000 meals delivered in 2018. Facing an expiring lease at their meal preparation site, Food For Free leverages their LSC relationship to work pro-bono with T3 Advisors to design and plan a new kitchen facility. Based on this design, Biogen makes a multi-year commitment to host Food For Free's meal preparation programs, including construction of a state-of-the-art kitchen at Biogen's Cambridge headquarters.

The ribbon is cut on the new kitchen and with added space comes the opportunity to take in and distribute even more food. LSC funds a new refrigerated truck and driver in order to facilitate further growth.

The pandemic hits, and that truck becomes critical to Food For Free's response as they pivot to provide groceries at school-based food sites and via home delivery in the Greater Cambridge area. From May-October of 2020, Food for Free distributed USDA-organized boxes of fresh produce (the Farmers to Families Food Box Program), to low-income households directly and through partnerships with food pantries in Boston, Cambridge, Chelsea, and Somerville.

With the USDA program scaled back in MA but food insecurity at record-high levels, Food for Free designs the Just Eats Grocery Box program to meet community needs. Using funds from our COVID-19 Response Fund, LSC signs on as a lead sponsor for Just Eats, which is up and running delivering fresh food items like potatoes, onions, carrots, apples, and oranges as well as staples like rice and dried beans to 3,000+ households each week. The program will run through 2021.

## Overcoming Challenges Together: Life Science Cares & Pine Street Inn

Our sector is rich with expertise and passion for collaboration, and it only makes sense to leverage these strengths in service of our nonprofit partners. That's why we launched the Life Science Cares Hackathon, a fun, fast-moving way for employee teams to use their expertise to give back.

In the midst of our regular and candid check-ins with our partners in late 2020, we learned that [Pine Street Inn](#) was facing obstacles increasing capacity at its iCater Job Training program.

iCater provides Pine Street Inn guests job training while also producing nutritious meals for shelter guests, group homes, and other nonprofits across Greater Boston. In the 20 years since its inception, the program has grown to serve nearly 3,000 meals per day. But as iCater has grown in scale and complexity, it became increasingly challenging (particularly with the ongoing pandemic) for Pine Street Inn operations to meet the demand. The iCater team struggled with the complexity of moving from bulk to individually packaged meals, space limitations due to COVID restrictions, and complexities around ordering and scheduling meal deliveries.

### **We put the power of our people to work.**

To do this right, we partnered with our friends at Slalom, to design and run the Hackathon. Over two weeks in early 2021 — via competition-wide Zooms, team-specific working sessions, and a final pitch and judging session—employee teams from Wave Life Sciences, Visterra and Alnylam Pharmaceuticals worked on solutions for the challenges presented to them.



While each team came up with easy-to-implement short term solutions and a plan to address more complex solutions long term, we had to choose a winner. The team from Wave Life Sciences squeaked ahead with their recommendations for cost-effective technology, shelving, packaging and transportation solutions.

Team Wave Life Sciences will work alongside the nonprofit to help enhance distribution capabilities to serve 5,000 meals a day to its shelter guests and other local human service agencies.

“It was a true honor for our team at Wave to help out with the important work of Pine Street Inn through the first-ever Life Science Cares Hackathon,” said Clara Gil, Senior Director, Supply Chain, Logistics & Procurement at Wave Life Sciences. “Even though COVID-19 has made face-to-face interactions a challenge, we appreciate the creative thinking by Life Science Cares to find ways for companies to support organizations who contribute so much to our local community. We look forward to continued work with Pine Street Inn as they incorporate our proposal and scale to grow their impact in the Boston area.”

Additional honors were given for Highest Value Impact (Wave Life Sciences), Most Feasible (Visterra & Alnylam in a tie) as well as Most Creative Ideas (Alnylam).




Based on the overwhelming success of the inaugural effort, LSC is already making plans to hack many more problems for our nonprofits in the years to come.



## Connecting for Opportunity: Life Science Cares & Project Onramp

Creating opportunity for all of our neighbors is one of our core values at Life Science Cares. We want our industry to reflect our community and to achieve this, we created the [Project Onramp](#) internship program in 2019 with partners MassBio, MassBioEd and the Massachusetts Life Sciences Center. Project Onramp connects passionate, high-achieving four-year college students with paid summer internships in the life science sector. Working with Bottom Line, whose students come from low-income backgrounds and are often first in their families to go to college, Project Onramp introduces a diverse cohort of students to careers in the life sciences. That benefits all of us.

### By the numbers

-  **89** total matched interns in Summers 2019 and 2020
- 96** interns hired for Summer 2021 (as of 4/21/21)
-  **96%** of Onramp Alums said they would definitely or more likely consider a career in industry following their internship
-  **18** Onramp alums have graduated college since 2019
- 9** (50%) are employed full-time in the life sciences or healthcare



### Q&A With Project Onramp 2019-2020 intern Le Tran

Le Tran is a senior at the University of Massachusetts Amherst pursuing a dual degree in Marketing (BBA) and Geography (BA) with a concentration in Urban Geography. He will graduate in May 2021.

**Q:** How did you get connected to Project Onramp?

**A:** I'm a part of a college access program called Bottom Line and my first exposure to project Onramp was actually two years ago going into my junior year. I was looking for an internship and it was the inaugural year of Project Onramp. My Bottom Line advisor was like "There's this new program in life sciences" and I was like "Life sciences? I don't know anything about life sciences. I'm a social science person." But at the time I had just transitioned to marketing and they said "there's even roles for you." So I was like "Ooh, this is new this is different!" That's how I got involved two years ago and I did an internship at EMD Serono [in summer 2019] and this past year at Moderna.

**Q:** Tell us more about your internship at Moderna.

**A:** I was a corporate communications intern so I worked on both internal and external stuff. Maybe it was just me not fully understanding the capacity that I was working at Moderna at that time. I was like yeah, trials and all (of the COVID-19 vaccine), but now that it's in usage, I'm like, oh wow, I was a part of that. So I thought that was actually amazing and looking back at it, I am like, wow, that was an experience. Obviously my internship was virtual and I didn't mind it being virtual at all actually. Because my bosses were so kind and so helpful and the team was very small. The communications team was three people including me and a VP. So it was nice to get to know them as people and they were easily accessible.





## Connecting for Opportunity: Life Science Cares & Project Onramp

### Q&A With Project Onramp 2019-2020 intern Le Tran Continued

A few things I worked on were reviving a speakers series within the company where employees share out what they are doing whether that's various vaccines, or communications stuff, or research, which I thought was very cool. I did a social media audit to see what people are doing. I also created a high level corporate deck just like "this is who we are this is what we do." We worked with the Calm app for wellness month and I created literature about that for employees.

**Q.** What surprised you about working for a life science company?

**A:** *I think there's a role for everyone in life sciences.* I was very jaded in the very beginning. I figured I have to know what these science terms are. But those are all things you can learn on the job and that you only have to have a low level understanding of them. As long as you know what's happening in a general sense. As a business person, I was able to be successful in my job. That was something I was very surprised about. Throughout the summer with Project Onramp we had mixers and professional development time and I met more life science professionals but people who were working in HR or business development and various non-research things. I was like "oh gosh this is kinda cool" and they all thoroughly enjoy what they do but I was very surprised by that. With my time at Moderna I was very pleased with my role there.

**Q:** Why should companies hire interns? What positive impacts do interns bring?

**A:** I think interns bring a lot of perspective—we're so young. We're so new. We also bring in talent that is sometimes lacking in a company. At my previous internship at EMD Serono, they ended up needing a mapping project where the company needed someone to map IVF clinics in relation to consumers. I was combing through census data and I was like "this is what I do in classes right now" and I knew how to do it all. That's just one example of how an intern can be so valuable.

For a company, for supervisors and bosses, being in a mentoring role can benefit employees as leaders. Sometimes bosses become better mentors after having an intern.

It's important—allowing students to get the exposure and experience in the sector. It can be difficult as a student, as an undergraduate, to get that experience. It's easier to hire interns [for permanent roles] when they have an understanding about how the company works.







## Caring in a Crisis: Our COVID-19 Response

When the coronavirus struck our community, the power of the Life Science Cares network was activated overnight. We immediately reached out to our nonprofit partners to determine their needs. In six weeks, our sector donated nearly \$2 million to LSC, which we then dispersed to 43 organizations on the front lines of protecting our most vulnerable neighbors.

Our COVID-19 Response effort provided not only lifesaving financial support to local nonprofits but also allowed us to help create a problem-solving network for partners that sourced everything from PPE and cleaning supplies to laptops and Wi-Fi hubs. We're proud of the impact we made together:

- **Raised \$1.8M of emergency funds** from 600 individuals and companies
- **Created a streamlined grant process** (one-page application) to ensure nonprofits could request funds with minimal administrative burden
- **Provided grants to 43 organizations** to assist with the unexpected costs of providing services for the duration of the COVID-19 crisis and the associated economic shut down
- **Held regular calls**, as frequently as once-a-week, with partner organizations to help understand their needs, link them with companies wanting to help, and collectively brainstorm around the issues that arose during the pandemic
- **Shifted our volunteer operations** to virtual, collaborative settings in order to continue providing meaningful support to nonprofits while giving employees an opportunity to safely lend a hand



In our rush to return to normal, as hope for the pandemic's end peers over the horizon, it's important to appreciate the ways in which "normal" wasn't working for far too many of our neighbors. The pandemic opened our eyes to how people experiencing poverty suffer disproportionately and how our neighbors of color are more at risk. **That's why Life Science Cares is investing in equity-focused initiatives to ensure a recovery that works for everyone:**

- We've joined The Boston Foundation as supporters of the [Chelsea 2021](#) initiative to ensure that this city, rich with a vibrant immigrant culture, can bounce back. Food insecurity and vaccine access have been problems for our neighbors and we're sending help.
- LSC is also funding the [We Got Us Empowerment Project](#), a Boston-based collective of Black community members, health care professionals, students, and allies committed to educating our community about medical racism, COVID, and the vaccine. Our partnership with [GOTVax](#), which uses a campaign and canvas strategy to reach residents in Roxbury, East Boston and other hard-hit communities, will support neighborhood-based vaccination clinics.
- Most recently, Life Science Cares has joined the public-private partnership [Cambridge RISE](#), a new Guaranteed Income Pilot Initiative providing much-needed support for Cambridge's most vulnerable residents and supporting national research around guaranteed income. The 18 month pilot will support 120 single caretaker households, both to increase financial stability and to understand the long-term impacts a guaranteed income has on local and national economic policy.



## Community

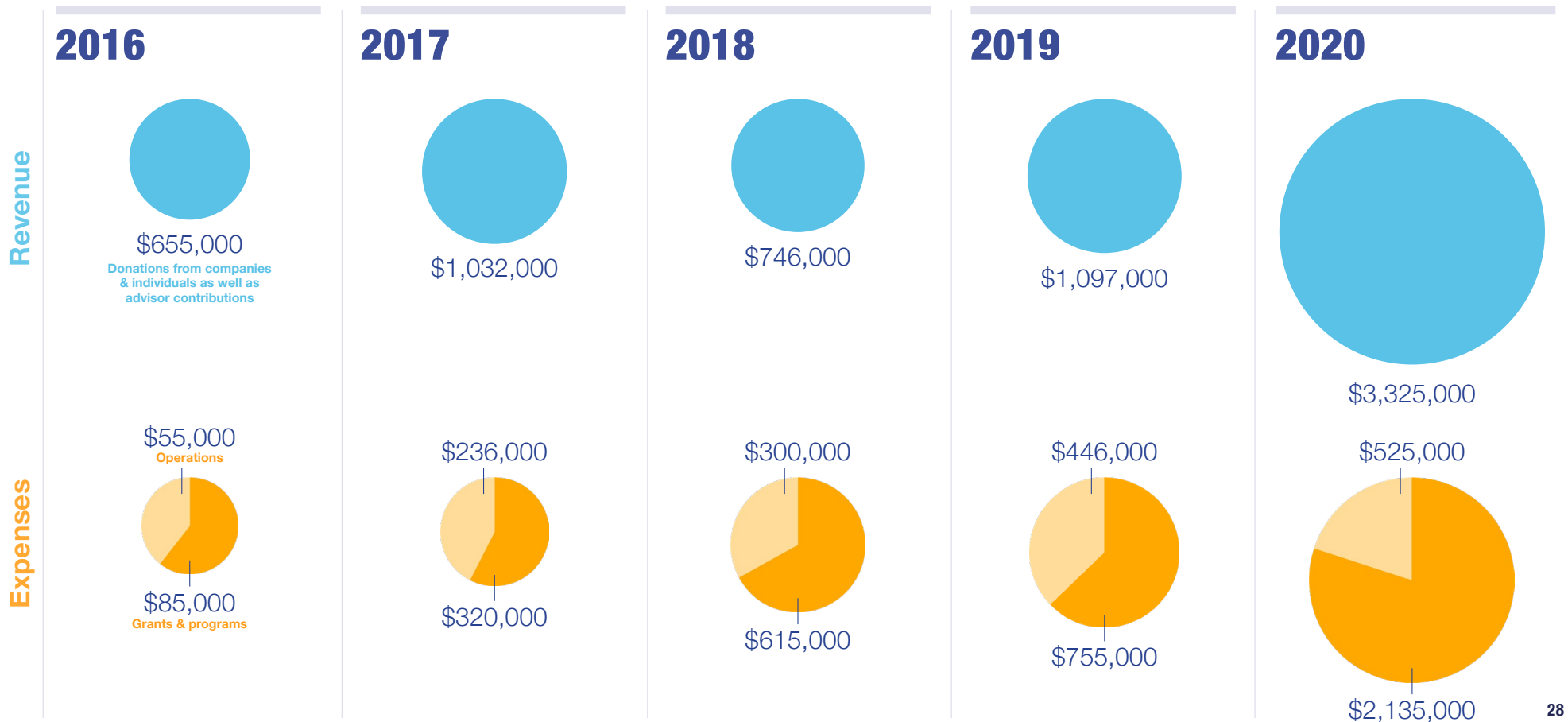

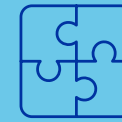


## What's Next
