STEAM KITS FOR MIDDLE SCHOOLERS (\$15-30/KIT)

STEAM Ahead focuses on providing students with access to STEAM in a fun and interactive way. These portable kits equip students with the flexibility to complete activities in the classrooms via group builds or at home. The kits accompany STEAM Ahead's custom curriculum that incorporates design challenges and introduces students to key vocabulary and concepts.

AI KITS FOR YOUTH IN STEM PROGRAMS (\$30-40/KIT)

These kits with **Innovators for Purpose** emphasize the software and conceptual side of AI, leveraging affordable hardware to introduce students to the basics of AI and machine learning. The focus is on learning and experimentation, which can spark interest in further exploration of AI technologies.

POWERFUL PLAYTIME KITS FOR YOUTH IN SHELTERS (\$20-30/KIT)

Horizons for Homeless Children has found how important play is for strengthening the parent-child bond and for children's early development. Many parents living in shelter do not have the resources, confidence, or skills to support their children's play, as it may not have been part of their own childhood. These kits, ideally given to each child living in shelter, include toys, books and a tip sheet on play for parents.

BACKPACKS FOR STUDENTS IMPACTED BY HOMELESSNESS (\$30-45/KIT)

Support middle and high school students impacted by homelessness across Massachusetts with **School on Wheels MA**! Backpacks will contain school supplies, including a scientific calculator, which is essential for students beginning their STEM education journeys.

ENVIRONMENTAL STEM KITS FOR YOUTH DEVELOPMENT (\$25/KIT)

These kits will support **West End House** members participating in their environmental science program (Ultimate Journey) relaunching later this spring. Kits will be accompanied with plant growth experiments and soil observations.

BOARDING SCHOOLS KITS FOR STUDENTS (\$200/KIT)

Each care package will support a young **Alexander Twilight Academy** student leaving home for the first time to attend a high school boarding school.

SUMMER ACTIVITY KITS FOR SUMMER YOUTH PROGRAMMING (\$30-45/KIT)

Julie's Family Learning Program is a welcoming, inclusive space that provides free educational programs and supportive services to help develop strong, successful families and adults. These kits will supply children (ages toddler to 12 years) and their adult education students with activity supply bags for the spring and summer.

Young Man with a Plan delivers holistic mentoring and success planning to over 200 young men aged 14 – 24 in Boston to help them make academic and SEL gains and access sustainable futures.
